Agenda Item I - Call to Order

Chair Greg King called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

Agenda Item II - Minutes

Mr. Keith Matsumoto made a motion, seconded by Mr. Russ Saito, to approve the minutes of the February 21, 2008 meeting. The motion was unanimously carried.

Agenda Item III

Mr. Aaron Fujioka explained the proposed amendments to Chapter 3-121 on procurement organization. The proposed historical note on page 121-2 tracks the prior interim rule amendments. §3-121-1 Duties and advisor, was amended to add the PPB audit procedures, as requested by the board. §3-121-1.01 Meetings, amends the format for clarity; and deletes repetitive language. Mr. Fujioka also pointed out the numbering correction to page 121-4, subsection (b). §3-121-6, Authority and duties, has been amended to add 'vendor lists', as the CPO also issues these. The corrections to page 121-

6, renumbering the second (2) to (3), and §3-121-17, Limits to delegation of authority, correction to page 121-9, renumbering the second (4) to (5) were also noted.

The board requested amending §3-121-1 Duties and advisor language on who may be audited.

- (a) The duties of . . . HRS. The procurement policy board:
- (1) Shall audit and monitor the implementation of its rules . . . ;
  - (2) May annually audit any entity subject to HRS chapters 103D and 103F, to be randomly selected, to ensure compliance with chapters 103D and 103F; and
  - (3) May select any entity subject to HRS chapters 103D and 103F, for compliance audits based upon:
    - (A) A pattern of non-compliance; or
    - (B) Any justification determined by the procurement policy board to warrant an audit.

Mr. Saito made a motion, seconded by Mr. Matsumoto, to approve the adoption, as interim rules, HAR Chapter 3-121 as amended, including the board's amendments and with the corrections as earlier noted. The motion was unanimously carried.

#### Agenda Item IV

Mr. Fujioka explained the proposed amendments to Chapter 3-128, on governmental relations and cooperative purchases. The proposed historical note on page 128-2 tracks the prior interim rule amendments. §3-128-2, Cooperative purchasing subject to chapter 103D, HRS, is amended for clarity by requiring in subsection (a), the prior written CPO approval, and by adding a provision detailing the prohibition of 'piggyback' onto an existing contract. §3-128-3, Cooperative purchasing agreements between procurement units and §3-128-7, Procurement of goods produced or services performed by governmental institutions, contain housekeeping amendments. §3-128-8, Compliance with federal requirement, is amended to clarify the applicability of this chapter.

The board requested amending §3-128-2, Cooperative purchasing subject to chapter 103D, HRS, language reflecting that the public notice needs to be done by both the entity subject to HRS chapter 103D, as well as the external procurement unit, which must include the subject entity in its public notice.

Mr. Saito made a motion, seconded by Ms. Pamela Torres, to approve the adoption, as interim rules, HAR Chapter 3-128 as amended, including the board's amendments to be revised by Ms. Patricia Ohara and SPO, and with the corrections as earlier noted. The motion was unanimously carried.

#### Agenda Item V

Ms. Saito requested that next month's agenda include a report by Ms. Ohara on the various versions of the proposed HAR Chapter 3-125, prompt payment rule changes.


